

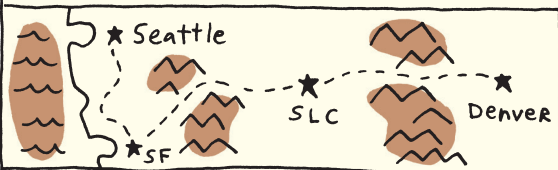
# A DAY IN VANCOUVER TOWNE

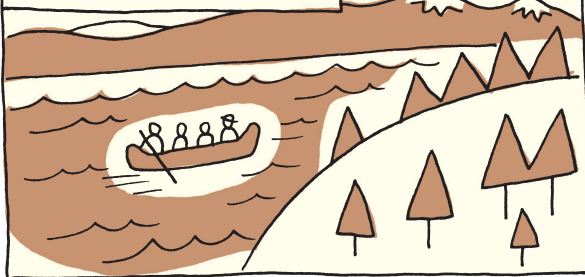

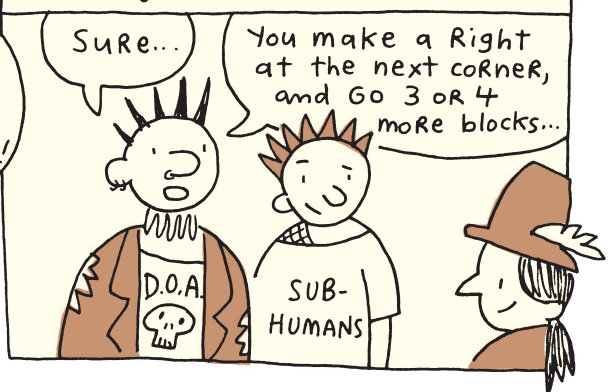

Evenn the moste Unorthodox of the Canadian Citizenrie treated us Kindlie, as strangers in ther lande.



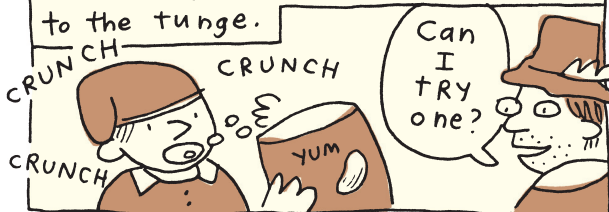

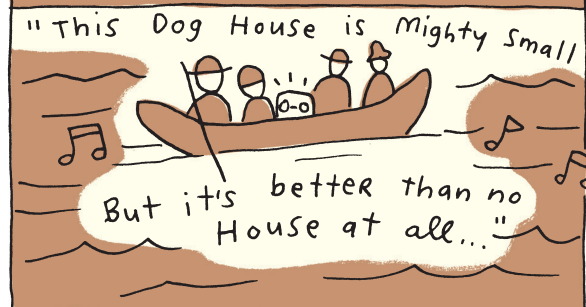
